2. Approval of Agenda

Ron Koetz motioned to approve the agenda as presented. Linda Montanez seconded. All in favor. Motion passed unanimously.

3. Approval of Minutes – August 8, 2018 Linda Montanez motioned to approve the minutes as presented. Jeff Davis seconded. All in favor. Motion passed unanimously.

 - A. Safe Routes to Schools grant. Marc Thielman worked the county to get the grant submitted. The overall cost of the work we are looking at ~\$400,000. We would be responsible for around 20% of the total cost.
 - B. Head Lice kits are on the way. We will be handing them out liberally to any student/family that needs them.
 - C. Compost Bin Marc Thielman is working with the new shop teacher, Casey Johnson to get it built soon.

 - A. New hires: None

 - C. Openings: HS Boys Basketball Coaches [if we have a team].
 - D. Fall Sports Update:

- i. HS: The fall sports season is in full swing. The Volleyball team has played 11 games so far and has an overall record of 5-6 and league record of 2-1. They have a 3-way matchup with North Douglas and Country Christian this Friday starting at 3:30pm.
- ii. MS VB: The girls have won their first match against Mohawk and play Toledo September 17th at home.
- iii. MS FB: The boys and girls playing football this year are quite excited to play 6-man football and playing their first game right now down on the football field. They play again September 19th at Triangle Lake. Scotty France and Leroy Lunsford attended the OSAA 6-man coaching clinic on August 19th in Hermiston.
