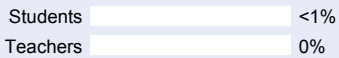

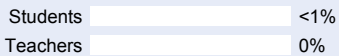

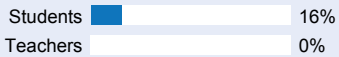

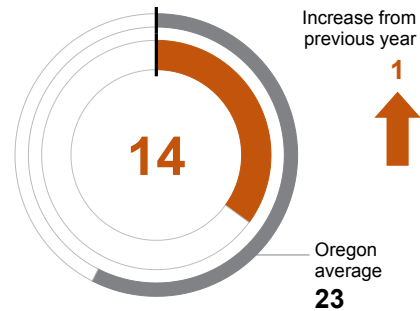

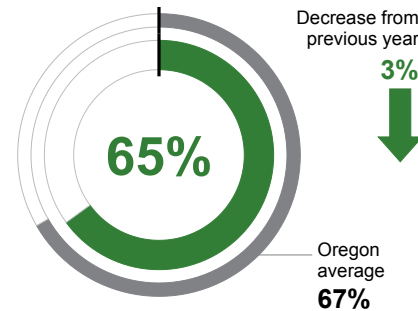
CLASS SIZE

REGULAR ATTENDERS

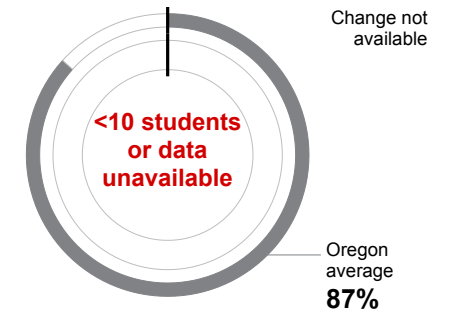
Students who attended more than 90% of their enrolled school days.

ON-TRACK TO GRADUATE

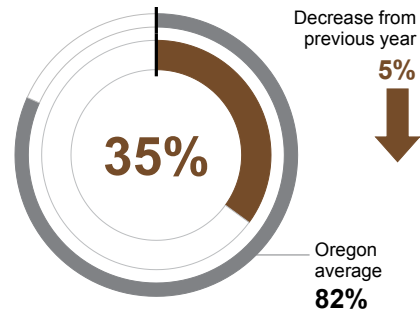
Students earning one-quarter of graduation credits in their 9th grade year.

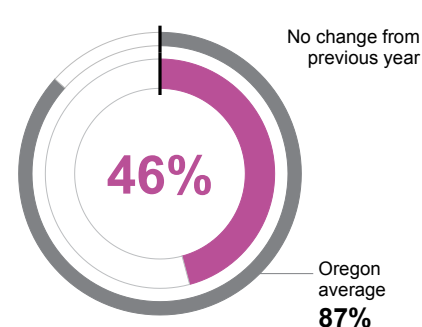
ON-TIME GRADUATION

Students earning a diploma within four years. Cohort includes students who were first-time ninth graders in 2020-21 graduating in 2023-24.



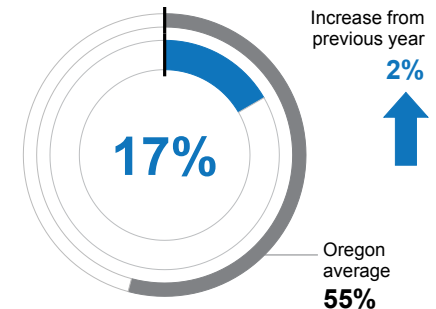
FIVE-YEAR COMPLETION

About Our School

ADVANCED COURSEWORK

Alsea Charter School works with Linn Benton Community College to provide our students access to college level courses. We are also partnering with Willamette Promise to integrate dual credit classes in our high school classes so that more students have the opportunity to participate. The district recently constructed a brand new Vocational Tech building, which includes a digital fabrication lab and welding/woodshop machinery. We also offer a Digital Design class that will incorporate graphic design into a school based business.

CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATION

Alsea Charter School has recently opened a new Vocational Tech Building, which houses a Digital Fabrication Lab, and a state of the art Welding and Wood Shop and classroom. We offer classes in Welding, Ag Construction, Industrial Arts, Forestry, and Plant and Animal Science. Alsea also offers other CTE courses including Culinary, Digital Design, Yearbook/Photography and Drawing and Painting. CTE classes are available to both high school and middle school students.

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Alsea Charter School offers the following High School sports through OSAA:

We provide our students in grades 5 - 8 with the opportunity to participate in football, volleyball, boys and girls basketball, and boys and girls track through our regional sports league.

We also provide after school programming for enrichment activities such as art, cooking and industrial arts. For students in grades K – 4, we offer club basketball teams during the winter months through a local boys and girls club.

PARENT & COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Our families and the school community can be involved in Alsea Charter School through a variety of activities. We provide opportunities for engagement through Open Houses, Parent/Teacher conferences, athletic events, and as well as opportunities to volunteer in our classrooms and on field trips. Weekly bulletins with school information are sent home, posted on our website and on our social media. Alsea Charter School has a Booster Club that is active in supporting our staff and students.
